MCofS Confirms Allt Duine Objection

The Mountaineering Council of Scotland (MCofS) wishes to make clear to Highland Councillors that the MCofS objects strongly to the proposed Allt Duine wind farm proposals.

The MCofS is disappointed that on page 9 (paragraph 6.30) of the Report by the Head of Planning and Building Standards, the summary of the MCofS's response to the consultation does not make clear that we object to this proposed wind farm.

MCofS President Brian Linington said: "The MCofS wants to make it absolutely clear; we have very serious concerns about the inappropriate location for this proposed development and we object in the strongest possible terms."
