Scottish Rock Volume 2 (North) is written by Gary Latter and follows on from Volume 1 (South) published in June 2008. Volume 2 covers a selection of the best routes and crags in Scotland, this time north of the natural demarcation of the Great Glen.

The Outer Hebrides receive plenty of attention and further north in the Northern Isles even more crags such as Beri Head and St John's Head are revealed.

All in all, volume 2 includes: Skye, Applecross, Torridon, Gairloch, Coigach & Assynt, Sutherland, Caithness, Lewis

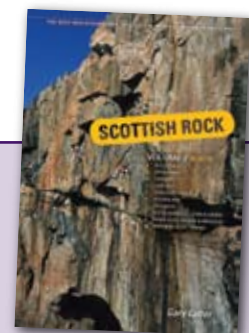
& Harris, Pabbay & Mingulay and Orkney.
